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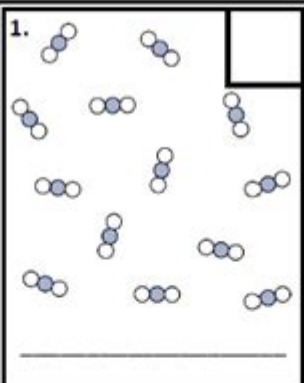

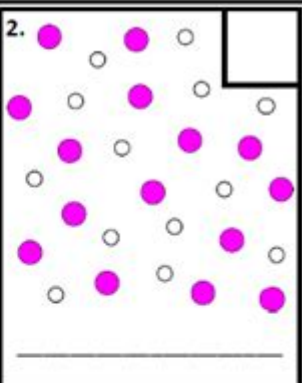
Each circle represents an atom.
The circles touch if there is a chemical bond between atoms.

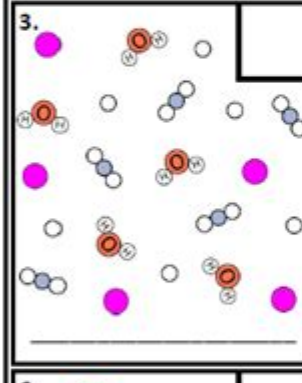
A. In the box on the top right, record how many different types of particles there are in each image.

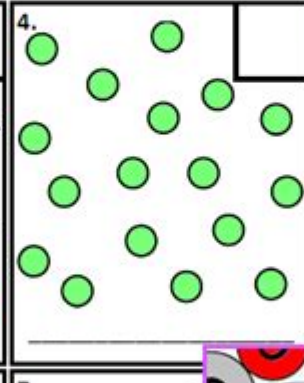
