There was a devout Muslim who spread Islam through the empire and made a famous pilgrimage to Mecca. This pilgrimage strongly established the Mali Empire throughout the Islamic and Christian spheres.

**1300 CE - Kingdom of Benin**  
Through a link with the trans-Saharan trade network, the Kingdom of Benin was able to thrive after the 1300s. At its peak, over 200 towns and villages were part of the kingdom.
