10. RECIPIENT: A PERSON OR THING THAT RECEIVES SOMETHING.

 - DRAW PICTURES OR SYMBOLS THAT REPRESENT THE MEANINGS OF THE WORDS.
3. REPETITION AND REVIEW:
 - REGULARLY REVIEW THE VOCABULARY WORDS AND THEIR MEANINGS.
 - USE SPACED REPETITION TO HELP COMMIT WORDS TO LONG-TERM MEMORY.
4. ENGAGEMENT THROUGH GAMES:

- PLAY WORD GAMES OR QUIZZES THAT FOCUS ON VOCABULARY.
- ENGAGE WITH PEERS IN DISCUSSIONS THAT REQUIRE THE USE OF NEW VOCABULARY.

5. WRITING PRACTICE:

- WRITE SHORT STORIES OR PARAGRAPHS INCORPORATING THE VOCABULARY WORDS.
- KEEP A VOCABULARY JOURNAL TO TRACK NEW WORDS AND THEIR USAGES.
