Cartels bay for minister's blood

PREDATORY cartels of "rampageous" preying on Zimbabwe's tax procurement systems, prejudicing government of millions of United States dollars, are bay for the blood of Finance minister Mthuli Ncube and his secretary George Gwumamanga who have been plugging revenue leakages.

Rampageousness — a term widely used in South Africa and has found space in investigative journalism lexicon — describes entities and individuals who leverage on their political connections to clinch lucrative public contracts.

In Zimbabwe's case, the cartels, colluding with corrupt enablers, mostly influential public officials, were rattled by a recent directive by Treasury to stop ministries and other departments from processing payments pending a review of contracts.

With the government being the largest procuring entity, it is estimated that it pays ZWS50 billion (approximately US\$110 million) to various suppliers of goods and

services per month, who in turn offload the local currency on the black market in exchange for stable foreign currencies.

According to the Comptroller and Auditor General (CG) Mthuli Ncube's report on public accounts for 2021, the government failed to account for millions of dollars in United States dollars after various suppliers were paid without supporting documents. The report was tabled before parliament this week.

As first reported by the Zimbabwe Independent on August 12, Gwumamanga, in a correspondence, directed all ministries, government departments and agencies to suspend payments with suppliers and review all running contracts as authorities battle to contain inflationary pressures.

A fortnight after the directive was issued, Treasury cancelled a tender awarded to a little known company, Bilum Investments, to supply parliament with 173 laptops at a cost of US\$1 602 755.77.

SA blackouts bleed Zim industry

ZIMBABWEAN industries, already battered by a long running economic crisis, have been thrown off balance by rolling blackouts in South Africa, which escalated this week, briefly grinding trade.

Implications of the power crisis will include shortages of raw materials imported from South Africa and steep rises in regional electricity costs as Sade's most industrialised economy slogs up electricity from neighbouring countries to feed its big industries, business leaders said.

Zimbabwe imports about 150 megawatts (MW) of power from South Africa to augment subdued output from its ageing plants, along with other imports from at least three Southern African neighbours.

Last year, Zesa spent US\$225 million on power imports from regional utilities, in-

cluding in South Africa, according to official data.

But there have been cutbacks since South African utility Eskom announced drastic reductions in generation of up to 2 400MW.

Signs of a frustrating phase ahead emerged
